this regulation army regulation ar 600 8 105 personnel general military orders august 2019 prescribes policies and mandated tasks governing military orders as a multifunctional program this regulation applies to the regular army the army national guard army national guard of the united states and the u s army reserve unless otherwise stated this publication is applicable during mobilization

this united states army manual army regulation ar 600 20 army command policy february 2021 prescribes the policies and responsibilities of command which include the army ready and resilient campaign plan military discipline and conduct the army military equal opportunity meo program the army harassment prevention and response program and the army sexual harassment assault response and prevention sharp program

this regulation army regulation ar 700 84 logistics issue and sale of personal clothing 22 july 2014 is a major revision it covers the issue and sale of personal clothing in the army it prescribes the policies procedures and responsibilities for the issue and sale of personal clothing to members of army activities and to department of the army civilians dacs it also describes systems for the

maintenance replacement and disposition of such clothing and gives conditions under which these systems apply policies and procedures in this regulation are designed specifically for enlisted soldiers active army army national guard arng and u s army reserve usar although limited policies or procedures may apply to warrant officers reserve officers training corps rotc army senior reserve officers training corps srotc junior reserve officers training corps jrotc dacs and rotc contracted employees additionally it applies to other personnel or organizations supported under the clothing replacement allowance cra or issue in kind systems or army military clothing store amcs operated by the exchange

army responded with great effort to a query from the senate armed services committee concerning readiness the committee was concerned that with the large sums of money being spent on new equipment for modernization a corresponding improvement was not being shown by the army in its monthly readiness reports it seemed logical that a tank battalion for example with the new m1 tank should be much more ready for combat than a battalion with the m60a3 tank yet the first battalions equipped with the m1 were reporting c 4 not combat ready after the tank had been fielded for 90 days or more the army and jcs response to the congressional committee convinced its chairman that the army was more capable with the new equipment but that these improvements in capability were not reflected in the usr ar 220 1 army regulation 220 1 reports on operational status of units as compared to documented requirements unit status reports are adversely affected by the major modernization program in equipment and by the documentation procedures for new equipment and force structure the army decided that this would be a good time to revise ar 220 1 and insure that the army is doing the best possible job of measuring status as an indicator of readiness author

Application of this regulation ensures that the research development test and evaluation (RDTE) decision making process considers the natural environmental factors that affect equipment performance when preparing capability requirements documents, operation mode summary mission profile (OMS/MP), and design criteria for acquisition specifications. Early consideration of design criteria and the OE reduces program risk and lowers life cycle costs by addressing environmental challenges and potential reliability shortfalls early in the RDTE process when corrective actions have minimum overall impact. Army equipment tends to remain in the active inventory for extended periods and is likely to be exposed to severe environmental conditions during its lifetime. Consequently, durability, operational costs, and performance over a full range of environmental factors must be considered during the RDTE process.

This publication, Army Regulation AR 360-1, The Army Public Affairs Program, 8 December 2017, is a major revision that provides guidelines for command and public information, including information released to the media and community relations programs intended for internal and external audiences with interest in the U.S. Army. This revision also defines the staff relationship of the public affairs officer, identifies public affairs as an inherently governmental function, requires commanders to appoint a unit public affairs representative to any unit that is not supported by a designated public affairs officer, updates policies for Army musical support, and adds official and unofficial site publishing guidance.
